GRAPPLING WITH MULTIPLE RELATIONSHIPS

CONCORDIA is an affinity group that currently has 7 members, 4 adults and 3 children.

Most people expect to have their emotional and sexual needs met in a private monogomous hetrosexual couple. CONCORDIA has redefined personal relationships by putting them into a political context. We see that the monogomous family supports and is inevitably bound into the economic, political, emotional, and psychological foundations of the system.

The privitisation of personal life shields it from political analysis, on a practical day to day basis. Issues around gender and sexual identification have been addressed, but little priority has been given to examining how individuals construct sexual relationships, and what they actually do with each other.

To extend our ideas and contacts, Concordia has organized a workshop to share experiences, insights, joys, and problems with other non-monogomous people. We are often seen as a threat by others, and our relationships are not valued simply because there is more than one of them. Creating an alternative to the monogomous couple that reflects our political ideals can be difficult, there doesn't seem to be much shared information or support.

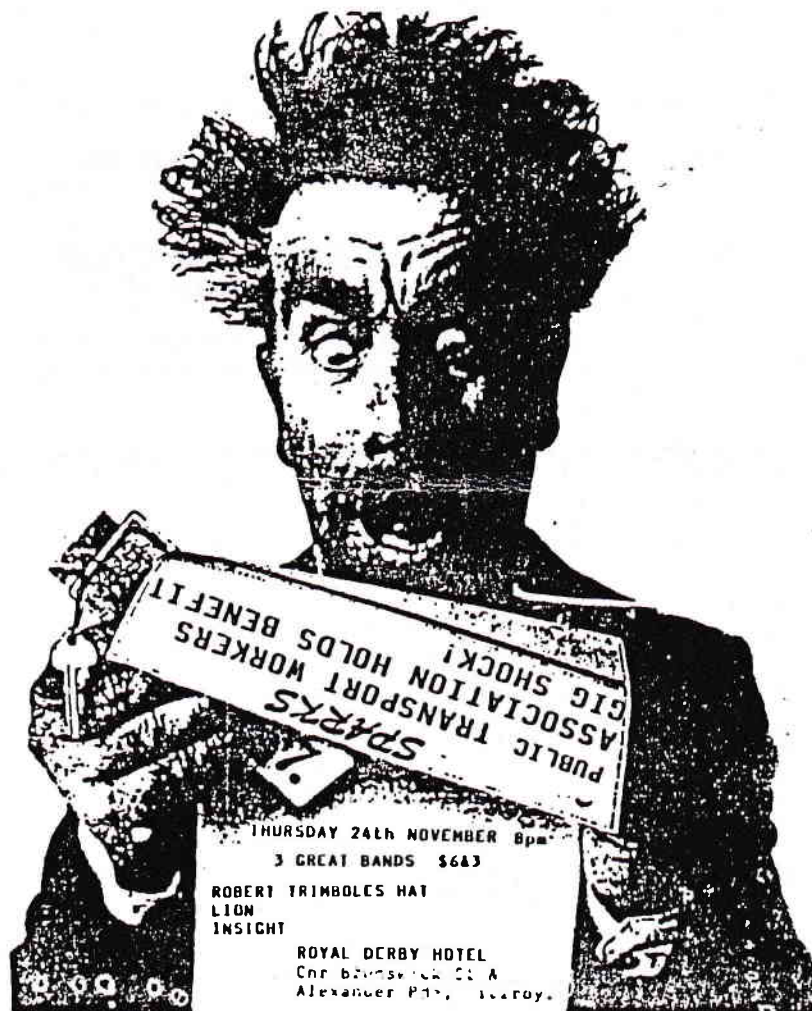
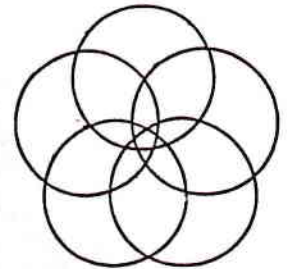

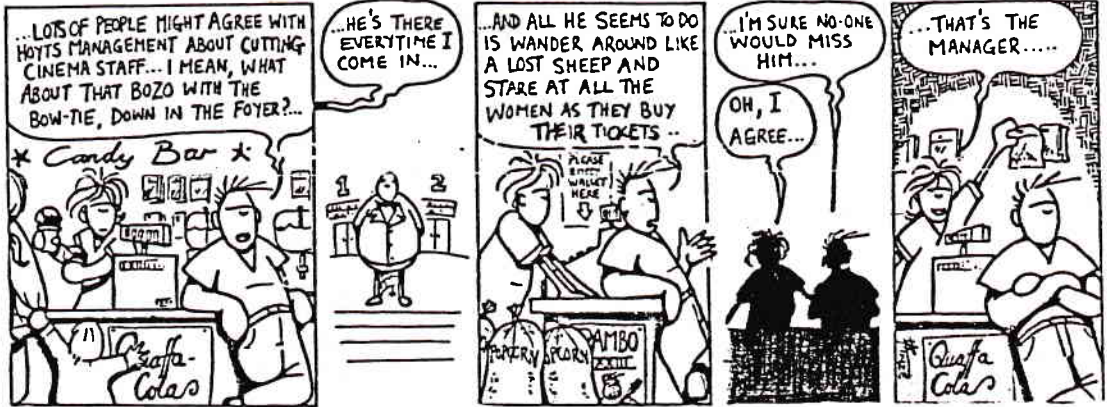


WOT'S HAPPENING*
